V.R. Eaton High School is a public, comprehensive high school located in Fort Worth that serves the communities of North Fort Worth, Haslet, and Newark. V.R. Eaton High School is the third comprehensive high school in Northwest ISD.

School

V.R. Eaton High School opened on August 25, 2015 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2018. We currently serve a population of 2,918 (as of 7/26/21) students. The academic school year consists of two semesters, each with two nine-week quarters. The school day is divided into eight 45-minute periods, with one embedded 35-minute tutorial period and one lunch period.

Students not only pursue superior academic achievement but also engage in music, drama, journalism, athletics, arts, career and technical pathways, and other fields that match their personal strengths and interests. NISD is a 1:1 computing device district that provides secondary students opportunities to be competitive and successful in a global marketplace.

Eaton is also the home of two academic academies: The Academy of Business Management and Entrepreneurship, which is a comprehensive 4-year business program that takes students out of the standard high school classroom and into an environment modeled after the corporate world and The Aviation Academy, which allows students the opportunity to begin dual credit college courses in aviation mechanical technology and/or a professional pilot pathway.

Graduation Requirements

Eaton High School students must have a minimum of 26 credits from courses taken during their middle and high school years. The 26 credits must include the following subject areas:

- English- 4 credits
- Social Studies-3 credit
- Physical Education- 1 credit
- Foreign Language- 2 credits
- Mathematics- 4 credits
- Science- 4 credits
- Speech- .5 credit
- Fine Arts- 1 credit

Grade Weighting and Reporting

Northwest ISD determines both an un-weighted grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale and a weighted GPA on a 7.0 scale. The un-weighted GPA is considered the student's GPA and is reported as such. The weighted GPA is only used in the determination of class rank. The college admissions process generally allows for students to indicate if the GPA and class ranking are weighted.

Rank: The calculation of class rank is calculated only using grades earned for high school credit in the following subjects and for electives under these subject areas: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Economics and Languages other than English.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation:

The District shall include in the calculation of GPA grades earned in all courses, including grades earned in middle school courses for high school credit. The GPA calculation shall exclude grades earned in or by a course for which a pass/fail grade is assigned; credit by examination, with or without prior instruction; local credit courses; academic courses substituted for physical education; summer school courses taken for remediation; and distance learning in the form of traditional correspondence courses.

Course Offerings

Eaton High School expects students to complete a challenging, college-preparatory curriculum. The most demanding courses include:

AP Classes: The following AP® courses are offered:

Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, English 3 Language and Composition, English 4 Literature and Composition, European History, Government and Politics, Physics I, Physics C, Physics E&M, Statistics, United States History, World History, Human Geography, Psychology, Environmental Science, Economics, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Capstone (Seminar Course), Music Theory, Art Studio 3D and Art Studio 2D Design. AP world language and culture courses offered include French, German and Spanish.

***AP is an open-enrollment program.**

Honors Classes: The following Honors course are offered:

(Pre-AP) are offered in English I & II, Algebra I & II, World Geography, Geometry, Computer Science, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish 2, 3, & 4, German 2 & 3, and French 2 & 3. In addition, Gifted and Talented (GT) classes are offered in 9th-12th grade English Language Arts, 9th-12th grade Social Studies classes, and in Geometry and Algebra 2.

Dual Credit Classes: Northwest ISD continues to offer a wide range of College Dual Credit classes. Students classified as juniors or seniors may earn credit toward high school graduation by completing a college-level course from an accredited college or university.

The following Dual Credit classes are offered:

U.T. Austin OnRamps Algebra, U.T. Austin OnRamps Computer Science, U.T. Austin OnRamps Pre-Calculus, U.T. Austin OnRamps Statistics, U.T. Austin OnRamps English, English Composition I & 2, College Algebra, Government, Economics, Speech, Psychology, World Literature, Aviation, and Pre-Calculus.

STAAR Scores

The STAAR, State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness assessment evaluates student learning based on the state-required curriculum—the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). Students are required to earn a passing score on the following STAAR tests: English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, and US History.
